

Expectations



RAs are supposed to make their **Professors'** life easier, not harder!

Expectations

- Treat your Professor professionally
- Clarify:
 - Scope and context of project
 - Mode of communication
 - Meetings and follow up reviews
 - Expected outputs and formats
 - Deadlines
 - Amount of time spent
 - Recommended resources (if any)
- Develop a research plan and strategy Track your research and work
- Be able to follow the research trajectory; know when to stop to clarify or recalibrate

Tip: Finding similar books via Subject Headings

- 1. Find a sample book of interest.
- 2. Under 'Subject', select relevant heading.
- 3. Select your subject. Note relevant adjacent subjects.
- 4. In the results list, 'Sort' by 'Reverse Year' for latest publications.







Loans

Law Library Deputy Borrower Authorization

Request your Professor or their aide to help fill up the <u>Authorization Form</u>. Owing outstanding library books / fines in your name could impact your graduation!

Borrowing for yourself (i.e. your RA work)

- RA patron account with additional borrowing privileges can be created.
- RA will be responsible for these materials.

Borrowing for faculty (i.e. for use by your Professor)

- RA can check out books on behalf of faculty.
- Faculty will be responsible for these materials.



Interlibrary Loan (ILL)

- Obtain materials outside NYU's collection
- Subject to other libraries' fulfillment
- Scans of chapters / sections are easier (and faster) to obtain than entire books



Interlibrary Loan (ILL)

- If you are requesting materials for use by your Professor (ILL books in particular), RAs must use the Faculty member's account to submit the request.
 - 1. Submit directly on the Faculty member's account if you are given the login credentials.
 - 2. Otherwise, email your request details (Faculty's name, citation information, date required by, any other details) to the ILL Department (ill@mercury.law.nyu.edu) on their behalf.




Legal Research

The Legal Research Process (Generally)

- Plan ahead!
- Secondary sources are a helpful starting point
- Remember, research is **iterative**
- Stuck? Ask a librarian





Research Plan

Elements of a Research Plan

- Each plan differs based on the complexity of the research question and resources available
- Check and refine your plan as you conduct your research
- Maintain a research log

 Legally relevant facts (both known and unknown) 2. Statement of legal issue(s) 3. Jurisdiction(s) 4. Potential sources and sequence 5. Search terms 6. Pragmatic factors: Deadline, time allocation, amount of resources

Possible Elements – ADAPT to Your Needs

1	Date accessed
2	Title / Citation
3	Search strategy: • Search string + filters (if online) • Tables, indexes or text (if print)
4	Source(s) / Provenance
5	URL / Physical location – use permalinks where available
6	Findings / Summary / Significance
7	Validity / Good law?
8	Follow up / Next steps


Finding Cases: General

'One Good Case' Method

- Obtain a suitable leading authority by recommendation, e.g. from your Professor or casebook.
- Enter citation into WL / LX
- View citing cases / co-citing cases

E.g. Searching *ZF Auto. US, Inc. v. Luxshare, Ltd.*, 142 S. Ct. 2078, 213 L. Ed. 2d 163 (2022) on <u>WL</u>







Finding Cases: Westlaw

Westlaw Key Number System

- Identify suitable Key
 Numbers, or use your 'one good case' to do so
- Search or browse via topic

E.g. Researching discovery in international arbitration in relation to 28 U.S.C. § 1782










Finding Court Documents:
Bloomberg Law

Bloomberg Law Dockets

- Pulls from PACER (the official source)
- Best to use a docket number where available
- Note: <u>Policy on Dockets Charges by</u>
 <u>Academic Users</u> (tldr; there is a monetary cap, do not request excessively)

E.g. Floyd et al v. The City of New York et al, Docket No. 1:08-cv-01034 (S.D.N.Y. Jan 31, 2008)
